PARTNERS IN LAW ENFORCEMENT (PILE)

We award up to 24 hours of academic credit to students who have completed a qualifying police academy.

Requirements:

- Students must have completed a qualifying statecertified police academy
- Qualifying law enforcement academies must be a minimum of 400 hours
- Academies must have been completed no more than five years prior to applying for course equivalencies
- Those who have completed a basic law enforcement academy of fewer than 400 hours may still be eligible for up to 12 hours of criminal justice elective credit

PARTNERS IN CORRECTIONS (PIC)

We award up to 24 hours of academic credit to students who have completed a qualifying corrections academy.

Requirements:

- Students must have completed a departmentally mandated corrections academy
- Qualifying corrections academies must be a minimum of 275 hours
- Academies must have been completed no more than five years prior to applying for course equivalencies
- Those who have completed corrections academy of fewer than 275 hours may still be eligible for up to 12 hours in criminal justice elective credit
